Welcome back to the Garden Council! The Board and I are happy to see you return. While enjoying the summer, we presented our Annual Report to the City of Fort Myers. We thought you might like to read a part of it and see all the accomplishments you have made during the past year.

Objective: Conduct programs and engage in educational activities that enlighten the Council and the general public as to the need for beautification, conservation and historic preservation:

- The Mina Edison Botanical Library is being joined by the "Botanical" Berne Davis Gardens. The Board has voted to make our lovely gardens a Botanical garden. Volunteers Carolee Drotos-Swales and Paula Novander are working on botanical signs. The gardens will be open on a regular basis to the public. We have become a member of the American Public Gardens Association. We are most excited about this, as is Berne Davis, and have Winnie Stone to thank for planting this idea and seeing it bloom.
- Sponsored a summer camp experience at Wekiva, a residential nature camp for 3rd to 8th grade students sponsored by the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs (FFGC).
- Sponsored a summer camp experience at the Edison Ford Winter Estates for a local child.

- Contributed to LARC, Inc. to assist in providing gardening opportunities for their clients. This effort was championed by Debbie Wyatt-Stotter, First Vice President.
- At each of our five general membership meetings, we have a standing agenda item to present floral designs and explain the design to attendees. Winnie Stone, Floral Design chair for the Garden Council, leads this effort.
- At each of our five general membership meetings we have a standing agenda item to present horticulture specimens and discuss their growing habits, their botanical names, and their uses to attendees. We added this item this year. Suzy Valentine, Horticulture Chair for the Garden Council, leads this effort.
- Two members of the Garden Council, Terry Pinck and Kathryn Patterson, were selected by the FFGC Committee to have their floral designs included in the FFGC 2013 Calendar. Terry was selected as the cover designer for the Calendar, which was announced at the FFGC Convention in Jacksonville this May. This is a major honor for both our members as competition is statewide and very strong.
- Established a Speakers Bureau to aid members in finding appropriate speakers for events. This is posted on the Garden Council website.
- Published 5 editions of the Courier, the Garden Council newsletter, which is sent to all members. Articles on upcoming events, gardening subjects, and current activities of the Garden Council are included. This is produced by volunteer Paula Novander, a member of the Garden Club

of Cape Coral and Potpourri Designers and the librarian of the Mina Edison Botanical Library.

(PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - continued - Annual Report to the City Of Fort Myers - presented Monday August 20, 2012)

- * Designed a brochure and handout to distribute at Garden Council public events to encourage membership in member clubs and societies. The Edison Ford Winter Estates, an Affiliate member of the Garden Council, has offered to make these available at their Information Booth.
- * Participated in efforts to protect our Southwest Florida water quality through the FFGC. Bernadette Hamera represented the Garden Council with FFGC.
- * Volunteers began conducting tours on a regularly scheduled basis. Tours were conducted twice a month in April and May, 2012. We plan to increase these to once a week beginning in October and will be coordinating with the schedule for garden tours at the Edison Ford Winter Estates, who has offered to encourage their attendees to visit the Berne Davis Gardens too.
- * Held our 2nd annual Open House on November 19th, 2011. Several demonstrations including palm weaving, boondoggling etc. were occurring as well as sale of orchids, bromeliads, garden gloves, cookbooks, to mention just a few. Lakes Park Enrichment Foundation, an Affiliate Member of the Garden Council, manned an information booth. About 40 people toured the Berne Davis Gardens after visiting the Garden Market at the Edison Ford Winter Estates as did a group of Master Gardeners led by our Assistant Treasurer and Master Gardener Carolee Drotos-Swales. Paula Novander organized this event.
- * Held the 3rd Annual Berne Davis Honorary Service Award Luncheon. Ena McGrattan, former President of the FMLCGC, was the recipient being honored for her commitment to her garden clubs and the Garden Council, especially in securing our current headquarters building. John Losleben, a 30 year member of the Greater Fort Myers Rose Society, was the runner up. Betty Mazzarella, Denise Baier, and Madeline Wallace, our Events Committee, did a fantastic job of arranging this luncheon.
- * Found a volunteer to assist in publicizing Garden Council activities. Jody Van Cooney had a career in this field for many years and brings that expertise to the Garden Council now. She has already had success getting the Berne Davis Service Award publicized as well as notices of our general membership meetings. We trust this will increase awareness of our member clubs and societies and encourage membership.
- * Completed a PowerPoint presentation about the Garden Council to be used at public events. A high school student did this work for us as part of her community service program. It was free of charge to the Garden Council and provided her a needed project. Again, this is an effort to increase awareness of our member clubs and societies and encourage membership.
- * Coordinated a bus trip to the Epcot FFGC Flower Show where some 30 members and non-members enjoyed learning about flowers, designs, and plants at this annual show. A trip to next year's event is planned.

In partnership with Edison Ford Winter Estates held Art in Bloom staged at the Caretaker's Cottage on the Estates. The winner is chosen by the public and this year Todd Roy, an employee of the Estates, won with an unusual design of palm spathes. He was teamed with Kim Hambor's ultraviolet photo of the "Edison Home".

- * Sent 175 Box Tops for Education and 175 Campbell Soup Labels to FFGC.
- * 29 members hosted a Holiday Night at the Edison Ford Winter Estates.
- * A tea for club and society presidents was held at the Berne Davis Gardens where the Presidents shared challenges they were encountering and benefited from the advice and counsel of others.
- * Too many events to mention were held by our member clubs and societies at which the public was invited; plant sales, flower shows, holiday auctions, open houses were among them.

Objective: Enhancing and beautifying public properties and parks.

- * Planted a coconut palm at the historic Edison Ford Winter Estates on Arbor Day 2012 in honor of the past presidents of the Garden Council. The Malay coconut is part of a program to replace the original coconuts that lined the fence on McGregor Blvd. Joyce Comingore led this effort for the Garden Council and thanks goes to Chris Pendleton, CEO of the Estates, and Debbie Hughes.
- * The Rose Society replanted the rose garden at the Berne Davis Gardens.
- * The Plant It Pink garden in the Berne Davis Gardens was replanted and the third Susan G. Komen birdhouse was erected. Proceeds from the birdhouse sales go to fighting breast cancer.
- * A gardener was hired to maintain the Berne Davis Gardens, which will supplement the efforts of our volunteers.
- * Appointed a Garden Council past president, Debbie Hughes, to serve on the Botanic Garden Committee of Lakes Park.
- * Added a pump to our recently installed water feature at the Berne Davis Gardens to aid in the elimination of duckweed.
- * Collected \$69 from attendance at general meetings to send to Penny Pines, which will help with the replanting of trees in this area of Florida. Again, Joyce Comingore led this effort.
- * New signs were erected to denote the location of the Berne Davis Gardens and Mina Edison Botanical Library. Berne even posed for a picture under one of them at our Open House!! Now that adds to the beauty of any place.

THAT GREEN THING - Once in a while those Internet forwards are worth passing on - hope you enjoy this one!

Checking out at the store, the young cashier suggested to the older woman that she should bring her own grocery bags because plastic bags weren't good for the environment.

The woman apologized and explained, "We didn't have this green thing back in my earlier days."

The clerk responded, "That's our problem today. Your generation did not care enough to save our environment for future generations."

She was right -- our generation didn't have the green thing in its day or didn't call it "green."

Back then, we returned milk bottles, soda bottles and beer bottles to the store. The store sent them back to the plant to be washed and sterilized and refilled, so it could use the same bottles

over and over. So they really were recycled. But we didn't have the green thing back in our day.

We walked up stairs, because we didn't have an escalator in every store and office building. We walked to the grocery store and didn't climb into a 300-horsepower machine every time we had to go two blocks. But she was right. We didn't have the green thing in our day.

Back then, we washed the baby's diapers because we didn't have the throw-away kind. We dried clothes on a line, not in an energy gobbling machine burning up 220 volts -- wind and solar power really did dry our clothes back in our early days. Kids got hand-me-down clothes from their brothers or sisters, not always brand-new clothing. But that young lady is right. We didn't have the green thing back in our day.

Back then, we had one TV, or radio, in the house -- not a TV in every room. And the TV had a small screen the size of a handkerchief (remember them?), not a screen the size of the state of Montana. In the kitchen, we blended and stirred by hand because we didn't have electric machines to do everything for us. When we packaged a fragile item to send in the mail, we used wadded up old newspapers to cushion it, not Styrofoam or plastic bubble wrap. Back then, we didn't fire up an engine and burn gasoline just to cut the lawn. We used a push mower that ran on human power. We exercised by working so we didn't need to go to a health club to run on treadmills that operate on electricity. But she's right. We didn't have the green thing back then.

We drank from a fountain when we were thirsty instead of using a cup or a plastic bottle every time we had a drink of water. We refilled writing pens with ink instead of buying a new pen and we replaced the razor blades in a razor instead of throwing away the whole razor just because the blade got dull. But we didn't have the green thing back then.

Back then, people took the streetcar or a bus and kids rode their bikes to school or walked instead of turning their moms into a 24-hour taxi service. We had one electrical outlet in a room, not an entire bank of sockets to power a dozen appliances. And we didn't need a computerized gadget to receive a signal beamed from satellites 2,000 miles out in space in order to find the nearest pizza joint.

But isn't it sad the current generation laments how wasteful we old folks were just because we didn't have the green thing back then?


