## Pick Your Own!

Recently, many of us have tried to minimize our trips to the large grocery stores, but still keep a current and fresh supply of fruits and veggies on hand. We are also hearing in the news how farmers have surplus crops. One of the great resources we have found are the "Pick your own" locations in Lee County. Since I'm not one to typically go out in to the fields. I have found that most of these also have an area with produce already picked and ready for purchase in smaller quantities. I recommend that you call ahead to check their hours and what produce is still available either for picking or purchase. The produce we have purchased at Biggars, Oakes Farms or Mike's has been delicious! It was also a fun outing and a pretty ride to get there.

Another avenue to consider is the Local Roots Online Farmers Market which is more than 40 local farmers market vendors selling their products, including fresh produce, cheese, breads, pastries, prepared meals, seafood, meats, seasonings, pastas, guacamole, salsas, pressed juices, soaps, hand sanitizer, crafts, BBQ and more. Local Roots online program offers home delivery and no-contract curbside pick-up two days a week (Wednesday & Saturday). Orders must be placed in advance. There are several curbside pickup locations, and home delivery is available for most residents in Lee County.

## PLANTING YOUR OWN FLORIDA VEGETABLE GARDEN



Vegetable gardening in Florida is quite different from what you might have experienced "Up North". In fact, you really don't garden much here in the Summer, but prepare the soil and get ready to plant in the Fall. A veggie garden can be as large or small as you want. Keep it in scale to what you can manage. You can even use containers! Attached are steps for planning a garden, along with a Vegetable Gardening Guide that gives recommended varieties and planting dates, yields and harvesting times. It is also from the University of Florida IFAS Extension office. This is the official site to which we Master Gardeners refer. Keep it as a link to good sources of information for any of your gardening needs.

Also attached is printout of how to prepare a Mound Garden. I received it back in my Master Gardener training and I know that Debbie Hughes at Edison & Ford Winter Estates uses it as well. It was developed by Kaye Cude. It is also often referred to as a "Lasagna Garden". Florida soil usually needs amending or enhancement to support a flourishing garden. You also need to protect your plants against microscopic critters like nematodes that live in the soil and will attach the roots of your plants. By creating a bed such as this, you both enhance the growing medium and imbed some barriers between the organisms and your plants.
