### Garden Class - Shade Gardening in SWFL

March 16, 2021 1:30 p.m.

One of the amazing aspects of tropical gardening is the variety of plants that can be grown, and in fact, thrive in a shady part of gardens. This class will help one design a multi-layered shade garden that mixes good texture, offers color and contrast and compliments existing plants or trees. Participants are encouraged to bring their shade garden challenges for ground cover, annual or perennial recommendations. Shade garden containers are another great way to highlight a darker area of a garden, lanai or screen room and design ideas for these spaces will also be covered. Many Florida native plants are perfect additions to a well-designed shady area and it's important to understand how they grow and how to choose complimentary non-natives to create a stunning shade garden. This class will also cover watering issues and maintenance. After the in-class experience, participants will walk through two shade gardens at the Estates. Classroom time: 60 minutes; garden time: 20 minutes. Cost is \$35 for members and \$50 for non-members.

#### News from the Estero Island Garden Club

Although so many of our events have been cancelled or modified this year, we are excited about a new project! The Estero Island Garden Club is partnering with the town of FMB and the historic Mound House to establish a native pollinator friendly demonstration garden in one of the town's right of ways.

The intent of the garden is to beautify our town and educate the public on the benefits of native plantings. Our first vice president, Randa Veach, is heading this project with support from several of our members that completed the Landscape Design Courses. The project is supported partly by funds from the NOAA-Planet Stewards Education Project grant that the Mound House received last year. The grant is also part of the island wide water quality testing that is being conducted to look at the nutrient source pollution originating from Fort Myers Beach. The Cocoloba Chapter of the Florida Native Plant Society has offered a generous donation of native plants and priceless advice! We are designing, planting and will be responsible for long term maintenance of the garden. We are hoping this garden will be the first of many similar projects on Fort Myers Beach.

#### "ART IN BLOOM" TO SHOWCASE TALENTS OF ISLAND FLORAL DESIGNERS AND ARTISTS

The popular "Art in Bloom" biennial event returns to the Sanibel Public Library for three days only on March 9, 10 and 11. Members of **Shell Islands Garden Club** have collaborated with artists from the Sanibel-Captiva Art League to produce an exhibit featuring innovative floral design and art. According to SIGC Vice President, Gwenda Hiett-Clements, "The show has generated such positive vibes from library patrons in the past. This will be the fifth time the Garden Club has presented Art in Bloom at the Sanibel Public Library. Fifteen floral designers are matched with 15 artists. The resulting flower arrangements are interpretations of the artists' paintings. The results are unbelievably creative and works of art in themselves."

The public is invited to view this special presentation at the library from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m. on March 9; 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on March 10; and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on March 11.
