The Strolling Flower Show is coming back to downtown Fort Myers. It will be held the weekend of Feb. 4, 2022, in conjunction with Art Walk. It is also the weekend of the Fort Myers Art Show, so there will be lots of exposure for the clubs and societies who would like to participate. FMLCGC plans to have a tent available to provide information about the Berne Davis Gardens and our member clubs/societies.

The Fort Myers-Lee County Garden Council (FMLCGC) will be working with the River District Alliance (RDA) to put on the show. The RDA will secure the windows for the designs, and FMLCGC will provide signage for the designs/displays.

Designs can be made from fresh or dried materials. They could also be an artfully arranged collection of plants, which would hopefully appeal to some of our member societies. Another idea could be a small design somewhere in a restaurant. Designs will need to be completed by 3pm, February 4 so that they are ready to be viewed by the public. BERNE DAVIS GARDEN UPDATE

NEVER A DULL MOMENT AT THE BERNE DAVIS GARDEN

This has been an eventful summer at The Berne Davis Botanical Garden. In June, a member of the Caloosa Rare Fruit Exchange was concerned about a mite on the lychee tree. The lychee erinose mite is a pest of lychee fruit trees. Without treatment, an infestation of mites can severely damage the tree, fruit, and flowers. The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS), Division of Plant Industry (DPI) was called. An inspector visited the garden a few days later and recommended treatment. It would be 12 to 18 months before DPI could treat the tree. Thankfully, our landscaper, Nick Gallant, was able to provide the necessary treatment. This involved complete defoliation of the tree and an application of a sulfur-based miticide treatment following defoliation and again, upon the onset of bud break/leaf flush. We are pleased to report that the tree is slowly recovering. Time will tell if the treatment has been successful.

The Bonsai Society of Southwest Florida has donated a bald cypress bonsai to the garden. Since this picture was taken, the Society has completed the installation of the bamboo background which nicely showcases both bonsai trees.

A special thank you to Susan Fero who worked on the Orchid Society area in June. She and her husband fixed, painted, and installed a trellis which will be used to display orchids. Nick Gallant also assisted with the installation.

It has been fun each week to discover which plants are blooming in the garden. Of special interest was the summer-blooming bromeliad Portea petropolitana. The plants produced tall coral colored bloom spikes with purple flowers. They were quite stunning.

The Berne Davis Garden will reopen on Tuesday, October 5th and will be open each Tuesday from 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM. Please visit us to see what is blooming in the garden. After your tour of the garden, you can relax by the fountain or in the gazebo. It is a wonderful way to recharge. We hope to see you there!

HORTICULTURE

"What's Your Favorite Plant?"

When a group of Florida gardeners were asked, õWhat& your favorite plant?ö the near-unanimous answer was, õFirebush!ö There are so many reasons! Firebush is heat and drought tolerant, attracts birds, butterflies, hummingbirds, and bees. It is attractive year-round, with pretty foliage, bright orange tubular flowers and seeds. Firebush has no serious insect or disease problems. Just be sure to plant it in an area that is well-drained as this plant does not like wet feet.



Hamelia patens var patens is the native variety, which can reach up to 15øhigh but can be maintained at 5-8øif necessary. Other non-native varieties (African Firebush, Hamelia patens var. glabra) have subtle differences to their leaves and flowers. There are even dwarf varieties, such as Hamelia patens õCompacta.ö

Not only is this plant attractive to butterflies and bees, but hummingbirds will regularly visit to sip the nectar. Fruit eating birds, such as mockingbirds and catbirds will enjoy the fruit as it darkens from orange to black. The Pluto Sphinx moth uses the leaves as larval food.

An occasional trimming will help keep your Firebush in good shape. Just be sure not to trim too often, as you could eliminate the flowers and fruit that are so attractive to wildlife.

This year I was frequently entertained by visiting bumblebeesô what a treat! Firebush is truly a Florida Friendly plantô whatøs not to like?
