THE FLORIDA FRIENDLY LANDSCAPING PROGRAM

The **Lee County Florida Master Gardener Volunteers** sponsor free classes to learn the nine principles that guide Florida Friendly Landscaping (FFL) in Lee County. The classes are two hours long with a question-and-answer period. Each principle is covered, so that you can apply what you learn to your garden. Among the topics of discussion are:

- *Plant selection and placement
- *Efficient irrigation
- *Mulching and fertilization
- *Attracting wildlife
- *Pest management
- *Yard waste and recycling
- *Protecting the water supply and the waterfront

An in-person class will be held on Friday November 5th, from 1-3 pm at Rotary Park, 5505 Rose Garden Rd., Cape Coral. Classes for 2022 will be announced at a later date. Rain barrel workshops will also be offered.

The FFL program makes creating and maintaining a quality landscape both easier and more Florida-Friendly through helpful concepts, tools, and techniques. A Florida Friendly landscape is not only beautiful, it is also environmentally friendly. The concepts presented contribute to preserving Florida's unique natural resources. What we do in our landscape matters!

STROLLING FLOWER SHOW UPDATE

As we mentioned in the last Courier, the Strolling Flower Show is coming back to downtown Fort Myers. It will be held the weekend of **February 4, 2022**, in conjunction with Art Walk. It's also the weekend of the Fort Myers Art Show, so there will be lots of exposure for the clubs and societies who would like to participate. The event will officially be open from 6pm to 8pm; voting for People's Choice will open at 6pm. The winner will be announced by the show sponsor (TBD) at 8:30 at 1st and Hendry Streets.

FMLCGC plans to have a tent available to provide information about the Berne Davis Gardens and our member clubs/societies. We'll be handing out small goodie bags (bottle of water, a few hard candies, maybe some seeds), so if your club would like to add anything to the bag or put information on the table, you are welcome to do so.

The Fort Myers-Lee County Garden Council (FMLCGC) will be working with the River District Alliance (RDA) to put on the show. The RDA will secure the windows for the designs, and FMLCGC will provide signage for the designs/displays.

Designs can be made from fresh or dried materials. They could also be an artfully arranged collection of plants, which would hopefully appeal to some of our member societies. Designs will need to be completed by 3pm, February 4 so that they are ready to be viewed by the public. They will need to stay in the window thru the weekend.

This first year will NOT be a FFGC judged event, so you have more leeway in your creations.

BERNE DAVIS GARDEN UPDATE

The Berne Davis Botanical Garden reopened October 5th to welcome visitors. Garden Council President, Susan Lawson has decorated the garden in a festive fall harvest theme. Additional plants have been placed along the path of the Larchmont Street entrance, and a new feature has been added to the area sponsored by the Bonsai Society of Southwest Florida. Hamilton Agnew has made and donated a Shishi-odoshi.

A Shishi-odoshi refers to a Japanese device made to frighten away animals which pose a threat to agriculture. It consists of a segmented tube, usually of bamboo, pivoted to one side of its balance point. At rest, its heavier end is down and resting against a rock. A trickle of water into the upper end of the tube accumulates and eventually moves the tube's centre of gravity past the pivot, causing the tube to rotate and dump out the water. The heavier end then falls back against the rock, making a sharp sound, and the cycle repeats. These fountains were originally intended to startle any herbivores, such as deer or boars, which may be grazing on the plants in the garden. Shishi-odoshi are now a part of the visual and aural design of gardens and are used primarily for their aesthetic value.

Be sure to stop by the garden to observe the Shishi-odoshi in action!

HORTICULTURE

Finally...it is getting cooler!! It's time to add a little spice to your life and grow some herbs! Whether you start them from seed or purchase them in a store (even grocery stores have potted herbs) it is a "crop" that you can grow on your windowsill or in your yard. Thyme, basil and oregano will tolerate winter sun (while in summer take part shade). Garlic chives are easy! Lemon balm will make a soothing tea and smells divine as does lemon grass. Cilantro is very popular for salsas but will not tolerate our summer sun or heat. Try growing culantro, a more heat tolerant variety with the same flavor to have it last longer. Sage is great for all those poultry dishes on the holidays. Texas



tarragon will last through summer. Borage has pretty blue edible flowers in the spring and is available in seeds. Parsley and dill are also popular herbs and two of my favorites. Dill will eventually flower and go to seed in the heat, but you can replant those seeds! Parsley will often live a year or more. Be sure to have enough to share with the Black Swallowtail butterflies that will lay their eggs on them in spring and munch them to stems if you are lucky! This year I am planting some seeds of Calendula officialis, a medicinal herb. Many varieties of herbs can be found at the Edison plant shop or seeds at Echo as well as various vendors and online.

AWARD APPLICATIONS

APPLYING FOR A FLORIDA FEDERATION OF GARDEN CLUB AWARD Sylvia Swartz, District IX Awards Chair

It's that time of year again – awards season and I'd like to encourage all clubs to apply for at least one FFGC award. Scrutinize the projects your club has carried out in the past year and see if you can fit your project to an award. All the awards are listed on the FFGC Awards website and there is lots of good advice there from state chair, Christy Linke, on how to apply. If you need any help or guidance regarding your application please contact me at 239-339-3778 or email me at tamargal2@aol.com – I'm always happy to help and if I don't know the answer to your question I will research it for you.

Below you will find a step-by-step description of what to do:

- Process: (usually carried out by the Club/Circle President or an Awards Committee)
 Review the entire list of Federation Awards at https://www.ffgc.org >FFGC-Awards-Descriptions
 - 1) Review completed and ongoing projects in your Club
 - 2) Select a relevant award
 - 3) Match your project to the award criteria
 - 4) Seek advice if required from District IX Awards Chair (Sylvia Swartz, 239-339-3778, tamargal2@aol.com)
- President of club or club Committee consults and decides who will write the application
- Person writing the award should:
 - 1) Download the application form from the FFGC Awards site
 - 2) Read the description of the selected award and comply with any detailed instructions that may be contained in that award description
 - 3) Source and check the information required regarding Category, Class (if applicable) and name of Award, District Number, number of members in the Club, etc., start date, finish date, etc.
 - 4) Write the description of the project, remembering not to exceed a total of 3 pages including photos and ensuring to speak to the criteria of the award
- Pointers:
 - 1) When writing the project description, remember to tell a story with an introduction, the detail, and an appropriate closing paragraph
 - 2) Select; insert; and caption appropriate photos of the project. Make the photos as large as you can to fill the space
 - 3) Assemble the application neatly no more than 3 pages total including application form

Scan and Email your application to ffgcawardentry@gmail.com to arrive by the due date (can vary but mostly Nov. 24 – notable exception Award #11: Yearbook which is due Nov. 1 and is MAILED to FFGC 3rd VP, Mary Whisler at 2755 N. Carnoustie Loop, Lecanto, FL 34461-6915

Some, like several youth and school awards and the Nell Coe Award are due in the New Year.

2021 is the Garden Club of Cape Coral's 25th Anniversary and plans are afoot for a birthday bash in May!


