BERNE DAVIS GARDEN UPDATE

Our new Cacti Corner is "Lookin' Sharp!"

Visitors to Berne Davis Botanical Garden have been delighted and inspired by a new feature that was created behind the Lorelei sculpture in early February. Utilizing a long forgotten cache of native stone discovered in a shady corner of the garden, our team of Lee Co. Master Gardener Volunteers redesigned the space to accommodate a generous donation of cacti and succulents from Suzy Valentine's collection.

There's a variety of prickly or smooth, and both tall or short forms of sun-loving succulents. Plans are being discussed to transform this mini rock-scape into a sea-floor-shipwreck scene to compliment the historical sculpture we are so proud to curate. The mythology that inspired "Lorelei" describes a legend of the siren that caused ships to wander and flounder in ancient times.

Contributions of shells — both large and small, will be welcomed at the Berne Davis facility to help create the underwater scene.

Bonsai Society of SWFL Expands our Bonsai Exhibit







The Bonsai Society of Southwest Florida invite all fellow Council Members and the public to visit our recently expanded display at the garden.

The Bonsai Society now has three large Bonsai displays as well as a Japanese water feature, known as a "deer chaser" or shika odoshi. Our original Bonsai tree is a Ficus Benjamina planted in the "tree on rock" style. The tree sits on top, wrapping the rock with its roots which eventually reach into the ground beneath. Next the club added a "Cypress Tree Forest," which groups multiple trees in one large rectangular pot. You may notice the larger trees are in front with the smaller trees to the back, giving it a forced perspective of a natural forest. Commonly used in landscapes, our latest addition of a Green Mound Ficus sits in a visually pleasing octagonal pot with a matching shaped stand.

All displays are elevated at a height proper for best viewing of the trees. Please note, all of our trees are in various stages of development, recovery and dormancy. Bonsai is an ever-changing and continuous art form that can be both challenging and rewarding.



HORTICULTURE by Wendy Sprague

I have adopted a guanabana....

Just this past weekend I acquired a new plant. After a few years of trying to decide what kind of tropical fruit tree I needed to complete my collection, I decided on a Annona muricata, commonly known as a soursop or guanabana (yes, I still have a hard time saying that last word, having excitedly told my friend I bought a "guana-banana or something"…) I have wanted a fruit tree in the Annona family and had been unable to decide which one of the knobby, oddly shaped fruits I wanted.

The soursop is native to Central and South America as well as the West Indies. My research showed that it can be grown in extreme south Florida. I know I am taking a chance growing it here in Alva, but I am counting on a little global warning to help me along. A soursop tree can reach 15-30' high but may be pruned to 8-12 feet and



maintained after it has finished fruiting. They prefer full sun and will require some protection from cold as they cannot withstand a freeze or long periods below 50F. This may be a challenge, but perhaps an over story of a much larger tree and some surrounding shrubbery will protect it? I will try and take the chance. It will need to be watered until it is established and will require only occasional watering during drought conditions once it is situated in it's new home. A balanced fertilizer with minor elements is recommended. The Annonas are deciduous, so my new little tree will lose it's leaves during the winter months. The seeds are toxic, so don't leave them lying around where children and pets can accidentally eat them.

So why grow a soursop or guanabana? Despite it's tart sounding name, it is a sweet, custard-like fruit that is somewhere between a strawberry and pineapple in flavor. The soursop is the only Annona that can be processed and canned. The pulp is commonly used in milkshakes and ice cream. And they look cool! Don't be afraid to do a little research and try an unusual tropical tree. You may be pleasantly surprised!
